Directive 2004/22/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 on measuring instruments

Scope (Article 1, Article 2(1) and Article 4)

This Directive lays down the requirements for the measurement tasks referred to in Article 3(1). measuring instruments must comply before they are offered on the market and/or in be put to use.

This directive applies to the measuring instruments described in the instrument specific Annexes III to XII (hereinafter referred to as 'instrument-specific annexes'). water meters (MI-001), gas meters and volume conversion instruments (MI-002), kilowatt-hour meters (MI-003), thermal energy meters (MI-004), measuring installations for continuous and dynamic measurement of quantities of liquids other than water (MI-005), automatic weighing instruments (MI-006), taximeters (MI-007), material measures (MI-008), dimensional measuring instruments (MI-009), and exhaust gas analyzers (MI-010).

For the purposes of this directive, the following definitions apply:

- 'measuring instrument': a device or system with a measuring function that falls under Article 2(1);
- 'part': a device, listed as such in the instrument-specific appendices, that functions independently and together with other compatible components, or a compatible measuring instrument constitutes a measuring instrument.

This directive is special with regard to the requirements for electromagnetic immunity Directive within the meaning of Article 2(3) of Directive 2014/30/EU of the European Parliament and the Council. That Directive remains applicable with regard to emission regulations.
